

Rationale

The word, **trasna**, means to cross, to choose which direction to go, to proceed. Not only the physical act of being at a crossroads, but also the spiritual transformation from our old way of living to a new way, from self-centeredness to God-centred, from ordinary to extraordinary. The Crossing Place is one of acting on a decision, of deciding which path will I take now – choosing.

We are living in a time where critical choices for individuals, communities, organisations and ultimately our global future are being made. To do so we are urged to attend to our deeper sources of knowledge, reach into our core, recognise and discern the spirit especially within the collective wisdom and to trust ourselves to a decision - which path will we take? - To contribute to the ongoing journey of the Plenary Council, in the Synod on Synodality and the Jubilee Year 2025 by providing formative opportunities, of exploration, understanding and competency development related to the areas and focus of these significant events in the life of the Catholic Church.
- To nurture the practice of being missionary synodal people, parishes, agencies and church.
- To capture the spirit and example of Pope Francis to the call of all the baptised to missionary discipleship in our lives and all levels of leadership roles at the service of mission.

All those passionate about mission, those in leadership roles in parishes, communities, organisations and agencies are invited to come together and join a moment of 'wonder' and 'presence' that may enable us all to choose, to be agents of hope and live the joy of the Gospel and lead and act for mission now.
